**STATEMENT OF ACCREDITATION:**

The programs of Hope International University listed below are accredited by the Association for Biblical Higher Education Commission on Accreditation (COA). The last comprehensive review of accredited programs was conducted by the COA in February 2016. The next comprehensive team visit will be conducted in the spring of 2025, followed by a COA review for reaffirmation of accreditation in February 2026. Current accreditation status expires February 28, 2026.

Programmatic accreditation is granted to individual programs on the basis that the accredited program evidences substantial compliance with ABHE's Programmatic Accreditation Standards, including documentation of the appropriateness, rigor, and achievement of the stated student learning outcomes. In the COA's judgment, the accredited programs had no significant deficiencies in satisfying the Programmatic Accreditation Standards or the related Essential Elements within the Standards. The institution's programs are currently in good standing with the ABHE Commission on Accreditation, and no sanctions (warning, probation, show cause why accreditation should be continued) are in effect.
