Pay Attention in this Shifting Season Change vs. Drift

- Approach Change as adaptive faithfulness
- Avoid Drift caused by unexamined compromise

Be Courageous, Not Combative

- Joshua 1:9 (ESV) Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."

Wisdom Over Speed

- Proverbs 19:2 (ESV) Desire without knowledge is not good, and whoever makes haste with his feet misses his way.

- Recognize the reality
- Holding conviction
- Making hard decisions

Have the Conviction to Shepherd as an Academic Leader

- Stewardship
- Care
- Formation

Strategy 1: Clarify Non-Negotiables

- What must not change?
- What can adapt?
- What no longer serves the mission?

Strategy 2: Lead with Narrative

- Explain the why
- Connect past faithfulness to future direction

Strategy 3: Mitigate Tension in Institutional Governance

- Clarify roles
- Create and follow predictable processes
- Honestly seek consultation

Strategy 4: Establish and Follow a Sustainable Pace for Change

- Sequence initiatives
- Allow recovery space
- Celebrate progress

Strategy 5: Invest in Faculty Resilience

- Clear expectations
- Development
- Spiritual encouragement

Strategy 6: Keep Students Central
