Rachel Campbell, Director of the Office of Title IX | Moody Bible Institute (IL)

Is your school ready for a formal complaint of sexual harassment? It can be challenging to balance institutional compliance with a sense of care for all those involved. This session walks step by step through the Title IX grievance process, from report and supportive measures to a formal complaint, notice, investigation, and a fair determination. We will clarify the roles of Coordinator, Investigator, and Decision-maker, then examine alternative resolution: when informal options fit and how to keep them voluntary and mission aligned.

- ▶ Distinguish the Coordinator, Investigator, and Decision-maker roles in the process
- ▶ Evaluate when and how to offer alternative resolution that is voluntary and compliant

1:00 – 1:45 SESSION 3: THREAT ASSESSMENT AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS FOR SMALL CAMPUSES

James Richardson, Director of the Office of Safety & Security | Cairn University (PA)

Campus risk spikes around specific events, from guest speakers to activism to personal crises, and preparedness has shifted from occasional drills to continuous readiness. This session helps institutions, especially those without a sworn police force, stand up or strengthen a behavioral threat assessment team, coordinate with local law enforcement and mental health resources, and prepare for active-threat and emergency scenarios in a way that fits a small-campus context.

2:30 – 3:15 SESSION 4: THE LEGAL LANDSCAPE OF AI DEEPFAKES AND IMAGE-BASED SEXUAL ABUSE

Christen Price, Senior Legal Counsel | National Center on Sexual Exploitation Law Center (DC)

AI-generated deepfakes and image-based sexual abuse have outpaced most campus policies, and the harm falls hardest on students, overwhelmingly women. Drawing on national legislative and litigation work, including the TAKE IT DOWN Act, this session maps the legal landscape institutions now face. It covers where nonconsensual synthetic imagery meets Title IX and student conduct, how to respond to victims with care, and what policies schools should adopt now.

- ▶ Explain how AI deepfakes and image-based abuse implicate Title IX and conduct
- ▶ Update policy to cover nonconsensual synthetic and off-campus imagery
- ▶ Respond to victims with a coordinated, dignity-centered process
